



Community Engagement Group grants program

Peninsula Quarries established the Peninsula Quarries Community Engagement Group (PQCEG) in 2018 to engage with the local community, part of this outreach is through the grants program.

Following the success of the first Community Engagement Group grants program in 2018, we are pleased to announce the 2019 program is now receiving applications.

In 2018 three groups were successful in applying for funds for their projects:

- Crib Point Community Garden to provide a water tank
- Somerville Rise Primary School to help restore a propagation shelter and
- Somerville Fire Brigade to help fund an LED message board for the community.

The PQCEG determined that grants are available for environmental projects to be undertaken within the Somerville, Tyabb or Mornington region.

Local not-for-profit groups are invited to submit an application for a grant from the PQCEG. Organisations are required to be incorporated entities.

The total pool available is \$5,000 per annum so applications should not exceed that amount and recurrent funding will not be provided. Applications close on Sunday 30th June 2019 and grant allocation will be decided at the first meeting after the closing date.
